The Bland Public Library recently sent out a request for Bland County High School yearbooks prior to consolidation. Cameron Burton, Head Librarian, said that there are numerous requests for the yearbooks. BCHS had multiple copies for a number of years of the *Bland High School Echo* and the *Rocky Gap High School Rogahi*. The Board of Directors voted to donate duplicate copies to the Library. We were able to give them 36 yearbooks from Bland High School and 15 yearbooks from Rocky Gap High School.

Adding these yearbooks to the ones already there, the Bland Library now has a nearly complete collection. We hope you will take the opportunity to view these yearbooks when you have occasion to be at the Bland Library. They are kept in a special cabinet and can be viewed in the library by asking the clerk at the Circulation Desk. They do not circulate, but they are now more accessible in our warm, comfortable Bland Public Library which is open many hours during the week and on Saturdays. 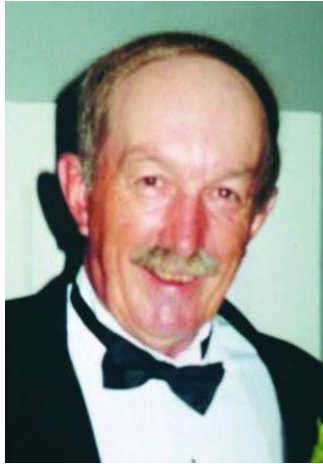

Memorial Tribute to BCHS Member:

Richard "Chaw" Havens

The Bland County Historical Society lost a valued member in September. Richard or "Chaw" Havens, as he was known to most, supported us through his knowledge of Bland County History and Genealogy. He was the "go-to" guy for "who was related to whom" for those of us called upon to answer genealogy questions. He helped solve many of the "Aunt Gertrude's Journal" questions. He regaled us with his Bland County stories – both true and exaggerated – when we joined him for breakfast at Tommy's (Town Square Restaurant). And then there was his influence as a history teacher for the hundreds of students he taught at Bland High School. All this knowledge about Bland County and his ability to relate it to us will be sorely missed.

"Chaw" Haven's obituary as it appeared in the Bland Messenger: Richard Crockett "Chaw" Havens, age 70 of Bland, Va., passed away Wednesday September 2, 2015. He was born in Bluefield on February 8, 1945, to the late Gordon "Doc" Crockett and Edith "Pete" Dillow Havens. Chaw was an avid historian and served on the Bland County Historical Society and a life time farmer in Bland County. He retired after 30 years of service in the Bland County School system, having served as Assistant Principal, History teacher, Business teacher and coach. He was a mentor to many students and parents throughout the county. Chaw was a member of two State Championship Basketball teams in 1962 and 1963 at Bland High School, and after graduating they retired his number 32 jersey. He said his greatest accomplishments in life was his son "Ritchie" and grandchildren especially Dylan. "He was loved by so many past students, colleagues, friend, family and citizens of Bland County. He has left an incredible legacy in the hearts of all that had the privilege to know him and love him. Survivors include his wife, Kathy Havens of Bland; son, Richard Gordon "Ritchie" and Sherri Havens of Bland; brother and sister-in-law, T. Cicero and Christine Havens of Bland; sister and brother-in-law, Jane and Ronnie Hall of Bland; three grandchildren, Richard Dylan Havens, Heather Dawn Rhodes, and Derek Neal Rhodes; special nieces and nephews Cicely M. Havens, Rachel Havens and Andy Slaughter, Brian and Anna Hall, Jason and Lisa Hall; sister-in-law and brothers-in-law, Pat Mitchell and Frank Underwood; two brothers-in-law and sisters-in-law, William Craig and Tina Hamilton and Jamie and Annette Chewning. A funeral service was held 6 p.m.. Saturday, September 5, 2015, at Highland Bland Funeral Chapel with the Reverend Kevin Richardson officiating. Graveside service were held Sunday, September 6, 2015, at 1 p.m. at the Morning Star Cemetery in Bland. The family received friends from 4 until 6 p.m. on Saturday at the Highland Bland Funeral Chapel. In lieu of flowers, the family is starting a Scholarship fund in memory of Richard "Chaw" Havens to be sent to BB&T c/o Cicely Havens or donations be made to the Bland County Historical Society or Bland County Fair Association.
