




The Bland Junior-Senior Prom was held at the Holiday Inn, Wytheville, Va. on May 12, 1979 from 8 until 12 o'clock.

Mrs. Elizabeth G. Newberry graduated from Pearisburg High School in 1953. She attended Radford College where she obtained a B.S. in Business Education in 1957 and an M.S. in Education in 1972.

Mrs. Newberry was co-sponsor of The Echo in 1977, and upon the retirement of Mrs. Hardy in 1978, accepted full sponsorship of The Echo. Her dedication and patience has meant much to the 1980 Echo Staff.


