Bland High School chose an interesting and workable theme for this year's edition of "The Echo." The yearbook staff broke tradition when the 1996 staff selected the theme for the upcoming school year; however, our choice "Once Upon Our Time" seemed also to be the favored and unanimous decision of the 1997 staffers and Photo-Journalism class. The incoming staffers consisting of one Senior, six Juniors, and four Sophomores readily understood the diversity of our theme. The Echo Staff very much enjoyed working around the school as if it were indeed a wonderful kingdom from a magical past time and place. Production costs of our yearbook were in excess of $\$ 13,000$ and took approximately 180 labor hours per student. With 8 students enrolled in Photo Journalism, this interesting statistic totals 1440 hours of yearbook preparation which does not include extra out-of-class hours for completion of layouts or editing.

of us at Bland Elementary and Bland High School were greatly saddened by the loss of Mrs. Ruth Kegley and Paul Harless. Their skills and talents will be
remembered as well as their loving presence. Their lives most assuredly left lasting and unforgettable impres sions.


Ruth Brown Kegley, a legendary name and friend of Bland High School who will always be remembered for outstanding school performances, died January 8, 1997. Ruth was born in Portsmouth, Virginia, on July 13, 1907. She graduated from Woodrow Wilson High School and Mary Washington College. She came to Bland County Schools in 1942 and taught until her retirement in 1972. She was a popular substitute teacher for an additional 18 years. She was a very versatile person, adapting from teaching any subject to coaching basketball, or introducing gymnastics. She assisted in the writing and directing of
"Down Through The Ages," the 1961 Bland County Bicentennial Pageant. For 11 years, Ruth wrote and directed the program for the school's Harvest Festival production, a combined effort of students and faculty to raise money for school supplies and equipment.

Christopher Paul Harless entered Bland Elementary School at the kindergarten level. Paul was a favorite with his teachers and students. His classmates were especially helpful, wanting to assist him whenever they could. For the past three years, Paul was rarely able to attend school, but his loving mother worked with him at home. Paul died on January 21, 1997.

COLOPHON: The Echo 1997 was printed and published by Taylor Publishing Company of Dallas, TX, at a cost in excess of $\$ 15,000$. It was designed by students entirely on IBM compatible computers with ULTRAVISION, a program developed exclusively for Taylor Publishing patrons. It was printed on 20 lb . gloss paper, $73 / 4 \mathrm{X}$ $101 / 2$ inches in size, and used
typefaces of Amazonia and Rinna. The cover used a Starburst Foil, and was designed by the Photo-Journalism Class at BHS. The cost of the yearbook was $\$ 30-\$ 36$ to the purchaser.

The yearbook representative was Richard Elliott of Knoxville, TN. Photographers were LifeTouch of Roanoke, and School Pictures of Bristol. The staff consisted of one Senior, six Juniors,
and four Sophomores, and two faculty advisers.

The theme, "Once Upon Our Time" was an original idea from Missy French, editor of the 1997 Yearbook. Students and advisers spent far in excess of 200 clock hours in preparing this book.
