A well-known figure around the school, Mr. David Davidson, accepted the position of bus driver and mechanic for Bland County, and was replaced by Mr. James Abel who proved equally capable of accomplishing the many needed and necessary tasks of maintenance. Student workers who were able to keep up with studies and work parttime were Jeff Brunk and Lorie Tabor.






### Science=Progress at Bland High

























# Visions of a Brighter Tomorrow










